






Background




- Parks and Water Bond Act of 2018 Proposition 68
- Over \$1 Billion in Funding
- Statewide Park Grant Program Competitive Grant Program for Park and Recreation Acquisition and Development \$395M Statewide in Round 2

Grant Information



- Eligible Projects
 - Create a New Park
 - Expand an Existing Park
 - Renovate an Existing Park
- Grant Criteria
 - Critical Lack of Park Space 15%
 - Significant Poverty 16%
 - New versus existing – new scores highest 10%
 - Community Based Planning 18%
 - Employment or Volunteer Opportunities 6%
 - Partnerships or Committed Funding 3%
 - Environmental Design 7%
 - Public Use Hours and Fees 5%
 - Community Challenges and Project Readiness 20%
- Maximum Grant Request \$8.5 Million

Potential Park Site




Community Input Thus Far
